#### BID enhancing safety measures

his summer, the West Chester Commercial BID team are working together with the Cheshire Police to make the area an even safer place to work and do business.

50 'thieves beware' signs are to be installed onto street lighting columns throughout the BID area, informing people that SelectaDNA Advanced Forensic Marking is used across the estate.

Businesses have also been receiving SelectaDNA marking kits and signage/stickers from the BID team to help deter thieves and make them think twice about targeting businesses in the West Chester Commercial BID.

For those that don't know, SelectaDNA is a forensic marking system which comes in kit form for domestic and commercial use. The product contains a liquid specifically DNA-coded to each individual customer or company, and which can easily be applied to any items of value.

The liquid also contains thousands of unique microdots, allowing the Police two ways to identify marked items. If equipment is stolen and later found, Police can link it directly with the crime scene. By placing SelectaDNA signage around your premises, it is proven to reduce your chances of being a victim of theft and burglary by up to 85%.

The provision of the SelectaDNA adds to the security provided by the West Chester Commercial BID over Christmas and New Year, at Easter and

across the May Bank Holidays. During this time there has been 24 hour cover via mobile patrols and on foot too, carried about by Alpha Omega Securities.

On top of this, the Rapid Text Service is always available for businesses to contact alongside scheduled Police surgeries, where people can drop in and raise any concerns they might have.

Our Rapid Text Service has proved useful too as was shown during the the recent incursion of travellers, when the service enabled early warnings to go out to all the subscribed members, giving them the opportunity to close their gates.

We have always had travellers going onto our sites even though nearby camps are provided by CWAC. With the BID reporting mechanisms, we have recently seen quick action taken by CWAC and the police.

I would encourage all those who haven't yet subscribed to ensure you register for the Rapid Text Service. You never know when a piece of useful information for you might come along.

We have all had our SelectaDNA kits and now the warning signs will begin to appear on the street lampposts, so that potential thieves don't have to go



all the way to our premises to discover that our properties are protected with unique DNA markers.

### Image improvements around the business park

o help maintain and improve the image of the West Chester Commercial BID, a number of initiatives have been carried out and agreed over recent months.

Before the start of spring, the Community Payback team at Ellesmere Port were drafted in to clear up rubbish at various locations within the West Chester Commercial BID.

Over a three day period, a total of 71 bags of litter were collected to help keep the estate looking clean and tidy for businesses, employees and prospective new tenants. Organised by the BID, Community Payback will be utilised in the future too.

On top of this, the BID team carried out an audit at the end of

April covering the West Chester Commercial BID geographical area.

Representatives from Environmental, Operations, Highways, Streetcare, Estates, Economic Development and the Enforcement Department at Cheshire West and Chester Council (CWAC) were present, with the BID team looking to establish some baseline agreements.

After discussions, it was agreed that CWAC would carry out a weekly litter pick and a road sweeper would go through the area every six weeks.

Confirmation was also given that weeding of the estate is to be done once in spring and then again in late summer.

In addition to the works that CWAC will deliver, the BID Executive Board have recently agreed to work with a Landscape Architect who will scope out image and signage improvements for the area.
