Project updates around West Chester Commercial BID

here have been a number of developments relating to West Chester Commercial BID's key themes in recent months. Please keep reading to bring yourself up to speed with the most recent information.

New Signage

The West Chester Commercial BID has agreed to fund three new image enhancement projects over the last year. These all help towards making the estate a more attractive place for businesses and employees to work.

The BID has approved funding for two large signs to be installed too. One will be situated on the land at B&S Group on Sovereign Way, while the other will be located on land at Bromborough Paints on Bumpers Lane. The signage company are now in the process of designing the signs and a draft will be sent to the board in the near future for approval.

Clean and Green

The BID Team continue to do monthly audits looking to pinpoint and report potential issues. There has been a significant increase in fly tipping on the estate and it is important that you notify the BID manager or CWAC of any problems you discover. You can do this via the 'Your Streets Portal' at www.westcheshireyourstreets.co.uk. Simply click the Streetcare Pledge tab and then provide the details of your issue.

Streetscene have been busy working despite COVID, cutting grass, weeding, litter picking and trimming overgrown areas on the estate. By working together, we can ensure that West Chester Commercial BID is a great place for employees and businesses to work and do business.

Security

A continued area of investment by the BID on safety and security was to have extra security patrols with the ongoing funding of Alpha Omega mobile security guards. This was increased following the intrusion of encampments to keep the estate safe. The BID also continues to work with the Police and the local PCSO to combat any anti-social behaviour and we encourage all the businesses to report any issues to Cheshire Police.

Training

Providing funded First Aid and other training courses for BID members is a top priority for the West Chester Commercial BID, and the BID Team is currently reviewing best practice to ensure training can recommence as safely as possible. The ongoing COVID-19 situation will be monitored closely and the BID Team will look to restart training courses towards





the end of the year. This will require a full Risk Assessment in terms of the premises and equipment, plus investment into PPE for delegates and new First Aid equipment to ensure social distancing can be adhered to during training courses and practical assessments. The training room will also be adapted to allow delegates to remain socially distanced throughout, with smaller classroom sizes to accommodate this. This will of course be subject to the ongoing situation and will only take place if safe to do so.

A unique insight into life at Laundry Tec since lockdown

eremy Hartigan, Managing Director of Laundry Tec, provides a unique insight into life at the company since the beginning of lockdown.

"At the start of 2020, I would have been amazed if anyone could predict what the year would entail.

As a major supplier of commercial laundry equipment to the healthcare sector, my company Laundry Tec Ltd envisaged a year of continued expansion. Our market covers new construction sites across the entire UK, after sales and support and also exports.

Our marketing strategy involves numerous awards and conferences. Almost immediately prior to 20th March we were to host a table at an event for 1000 healthcare professionals. Days before, our largest clients withdrew from attending and slightly awkwardly we cancelled our attendance.

Despite feeling slightly sheepish about cancelling, in hindsight it was undoubtedly a wise move. Workload wise the construction industry marched to a sloth like pace as contractors withdrew from sites for isolation or accommodation issues.

Thankfully although almost all of our healthcare clients commenced home working, online meetings and isolation, our services were essential to control infection and we have attended sites every day.

We immediately commenced every available aspect of infection control, providing numerous changes of clothes for engineers to change between sites, full PPE and even installing a shower at our offices for staff to disinfect before returning home.

On site we insisted all areas we were working in were isolated, and thankfully despite having numerous staff sometimes entering 4 to 5 care homes (including some with significant infection levels), we're proud to say that we have avoided any cases of infection so far.



As we crawl to normality we are extremely confident about the future and are looking to expand staff and resources.

Looking back to working straight through, the days of engineers being questioned about being on the road needing to travel seems almost a dream.

Personally I am still very apprehensive about returning to face to face meetings and office days. Why would I travel all day to London when I can sit behind a laptop and have 5 or 6 meetings a day?

We have learned a lot from lockdown and are reviewing the operational process of the company.

We're also feeling positive and enthusiastic about the new world we're about to enter."
