MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Has summer been and gone? We haven't had any hosepipe bans so maybe we have it still to look forward to!

Spring, summer or autumn, the work of the BID doesn't stop. The recent heavy rains have caused sporadic flooding in parts of the park, and I would encourage everyone to check their gutters and make sure they are clear of debris.

At the AGM on the 11th May, George Ablett from the Climate Change Team at Cheshire West and Chester Council gave a presentation. He said that the council has two targets for decarbonizing the borough, and that 11% of the borough's emissions come from smaller businesses. The council is offering funding and training to help businesses understand their carbon emissions and reduce them.

He spoke about the UK Shared Prosperity Fund and how it can be used to reduce both CO2 emissions and energy costs. He said that the council will be offering advisory visits to businesses to help them identify opportunities to reduce their energy costs and emissions. A grant program will also be rolled out in 2023, 2024, and 2025.

The CCTV system, which has been a long time coming, has been going through the bureaucratic process. All agreements are in place, and we are just waiting for a contractor to connect the equipment into the power supplies. So maybe late August, early September we will have completed the project.

On to BID member news and QHP, a manufacturer of gas loaded Bladder, Piston and Diaphragm Accumulators, has invested £2 million into their main production site.



Elsewhere, Harlech Foodservice has won a three-year contract to supply the Welsh NHS with groceries, and we're also pleased to welcome two new businesses to West Chester - United Carpets and Beds, and Smashed Grapes.

I would ask you to take a close look at The Workplace Charging Scheme (WCS) which is a voucher-based scheme that provides eligible applicants with support towards the upfront costs of the purchase and installation of electric vehicle (EV) charge points.

I hope that you all have managed to plan some R & R to look forward to in the next few weeks and are able to relieve the stress we are all under.

NHS CONTRACT WIN FOR TOP WHOLESALER

Harlech Foodservice, which has a base here in Chester, says it is 'hugely proud' after winning a contract to help feed 11,000 Welsh hospital patients every day.

The three-year deal to supply the Welsh NHS with groceries will create nine new jobs and provide continued stability for the rest of the 200-strong workforce.

The firm, which celebrated its 50th anniversary last year and has its headquarters in Criccieth, Gwynedd, will be delivering 450 lines of dry store products such as canned goods, pulses and rice to 120 locations across Wales, including general hospitals and community hospitals.

As well as its traditional customer base in the hospitality sector, Harlech also supplies schools across the six counties of North Wales and into the North West to serve up nutritious meals for 150,000 pupils daily.

In addition, Harlech is a major supplier to care homes across North and Mid Wales and has seen significant growth in that sector too.

As a result, the company is on course for record sales this year, and as part of its growth strategy, has invested £500,000 to increase storage capacity, reconfiguring the racking in its giant freezer and buying "bendy" forklift trucks to navigate the narrower aisles.

Health, Care and Education Director, Mark Lawton, said that winning the new business from NHS Wales was a major vote of confidence in Harlech.



"The fact that we have been chosen as a trusted supplier is a real badge of honour and shows that Harlech delivers the gold standard in terms of food distribution, that we are safe, secure and compliant enough to supply hospitals across Wales."

"It sends an excellent message to all our existing customers and prospective customers, giving them reassurance and peace of mind about the quality of our service."



Between its three locations of Criccieth, Chester and Merthyr Tydfil, Harlech Foodservice delivers up to 5,000 product lines to cafes, restaurants, pubs and public sector customers across the North West of England, Shropshire, the Midlands and the whole of Wales.

AGM TAKES PLACE


This year's AGM took place on Thursday 11th May at Chester City Football Club, and it was great to see so many BID members in attendance.




WORKPLACE CHARGING SCHEME
